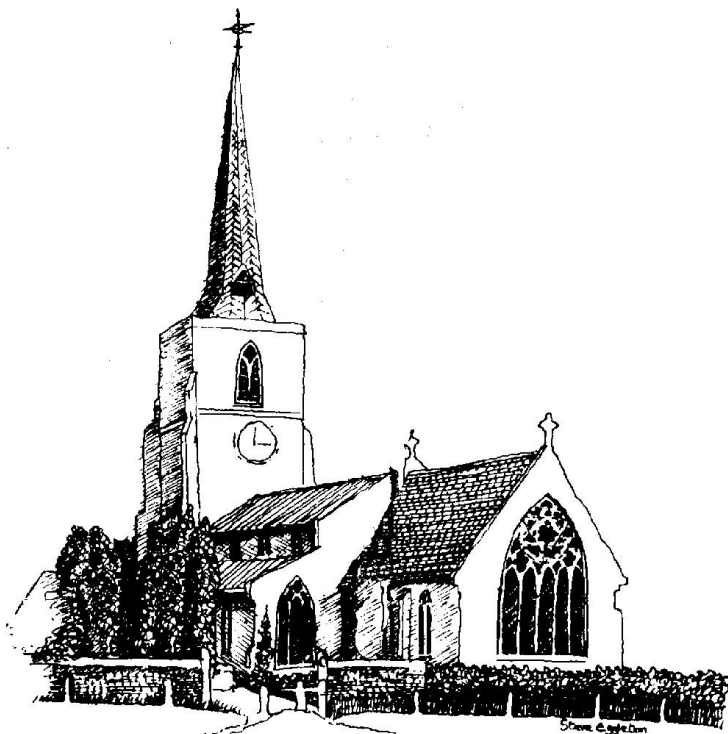

So why The Friends of Banham Church?

The Church belongs to us all, and whether you regularly worship, or come just occasionally in times of need or celebration, what can we do to ensure it continues to be there for all.

St Mary's has played a central part in the life of Banham for over 600 years, and generations of our villagers have been baptised, married, buried and worshipped there. An asset to the community, its 125 foot spire is a landmark to be seen for miles around the village, especially when lit at night, and its beautiful architecture set back from the green gives us something to be very proud of.

Throughout its life it has been altered and repaired to meet the changing needs of the village.

Occasionally, such as now, we can attract outside funding such as the heritage lottery grant to deal with some of the major issues, but this does not cover the full extent of works so further fund raising is always needed. Whilst the day to day running costs are met by the congregation, The Friends of Banham Church was set up to bring in and include the wider community in helping to maintain and develop the building and all that goes with it, and to keep it for future generations to enjoy.

As well as the regular Sunday services the community are welcomed in many ways, through Saturday Café, Open Door, Messy Church and Youth Café among many others. FOBC plays its part with the now regular "Movies at St Marys" Film and meal evenings, enjoying a glass of wine whilst you watch the latest great film (bring your own cushion!!). Even just to know it is somewhere open to go and sit and enjoy in peace

The Friends, a registered charity raise funds both through some great social events such as the films, the quiz night and progressive lunch, and so importantly by annual subscription, suggested at £10, and forms can be picked up from any of our events. Members are kept informed through our annual newsletter, meetings and now facebook page.

In the past FOBC has helped fund window refurbishment, notice boards, heating, path lights, the glass porch doors and most recently towards the screen, projector and sound system improvements, but as always there is so much more we could do with your help and support.

Please come and find out more, and you will be sure of a warm welcome at our next film night "A Street Cat named Bob (12a)", or at our AGM on 27th April, and be a part of keeping this glorious historic centrepiece here for all.

News from Norfolk County Council

Norfolk's Most Borrowed Library Books Revealed

Norfolk libraries' most borrowed books for 2015-2016 have been revealed, with a mix of adults and children's favourites topping the chart. The most borrowed book, being issued 1,854 times in the county across the year, was **Susan Lewis's novel Too Close To Home**. The 10 most borrowed books were loaned out in the county more than 16,000 times. In total, Norfolk County Council's libraries issued more than five million items in 2015-16. While the vast majority of these items were books, e-books, e-audio books, e-magazines, DVDs, CDs and console games are included within that total. It is free to join Norfolk libraries and borrow books. Books can also be returned to any county library, not just the one they were borrowed from.

Norwich Highway Changes. Golden Ball Street

The permanent closure to traffic and completion of works on All Saints Street, Ber Street and Golden Ball Street have an expected completion date for the end of May 2017. The changes are designed to help increase footfall and boost trade to local businesses.

News from Breckland District Council

New Buckenham Play Area Awarded Breckland Community Grant

Breckland Council will provide £5,000 for the upgrade project - the rest of the money coming from the parish council. The money will be used to help deliver the play park improvement scheme, expected to cost a total of £10,051.

Three new pieces of equipment for young children – a crawl tunnel, play train and speaking tubes – will be installed at the existing play area on Wymondham Road with a three-person swing set for older children and it is hoped that the work will start over the summer.

Breckland Council's Website easier for Residents to use.

The revised layout is simpler and clearer, making it easier to find commonly requested information, such as bin collection days, council tax queries, planning applications and ward representative details.

It also features top tasks so residents can easily pay their invoices, council tax, business rates, and garden waste subscriptions online. Simple forms are in place to enable customers to report any issues or changes in their circumstances, such as their address. Applications for things like postal votes or online billing can also be completed online. It is designed to be used on phones and tablets as well as a PC or laptop, so people can contact the council online 24-7.

Garden Jottings from Ken



That's enough!, there's just too many coming in and spoiling everything, no matter how hard you try to tolerate them they just don't seem to respect people's property. If you want to keep things nice, securing your borders seems to make perfect sense, so it's time to make a stand and keep the blighters out. I know they don't mean to annoy (it's natural behaviour to them), but with their big feet, long ears and fluffy tails, bugsy and his mates can hop right back to wherever they came from and leave our plants alone!

Whether it's to keep rabbits, deer, or neighbours out, or pets and children in, making sure that your boundaries are in good order is an important job.

As an island we're never far from water, and if space allowed, a return to having moats around properties would be a good thing to see, and they'd be great for wildlife, especially birds, but they're not really an option for the average sized garden. The next thing to consider might be a wall, solid, secure and long-lasting, but expensive especially over a long length (although it seems that maybe you can expect your neighbour to pay!).

For most of us, putting up or repairing a fence is probably going to be the best solution. A fine mesh wire netting is going to be the cheapest option, fairly quick to install and flexible for awkward shaped areas, but a wooden fence is the most popular choice, it's available in a range of different styles to suit any garden, and if built properly will last for many years. Even the standard 6 x 6 fence panel has come of age, the 'Ultimate' panel has smooth sawn and planed timber (no rough bits), a fully framed and jointed surround, and the best bit is it's all pressure treated for an extra long life, so no more painting (unless you want to), but still realistically priced.

Don't forget bunnies can dig, so sink gravel boards or netting into the ground, and if deer are the problem make sure you have enough height to deter them. Putting up a boundary may look a bit harsh, so make a feature of it and add climbers to soften the look, or create borders in front and plant to your heart's delight, at least your efforts won't get destroyed by unwanted intruders!

A view from the Rectory - March

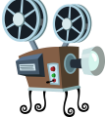
“How far that little candle throws his beams! So shines a good deed in a weary world.” William Shakespeare

Old Buckenham Annual Parish Meeting 2017

Main Hall, Old Buckenham Village Hall, Friday 17th March, 7.30pm

The main topic of discussion at the Annual Parish Meeting will be the future management of Old Buckenham Green. The Parish Council has been approached by the Green Rights' Proprietors to take on the management of the Green for an initial 5 year term; discussions on the content of the management agreement are in progress and by the date of this meeting the Parish Council will be able to present to the residents of Old Buckenham the content of the proposed agreement.

There is also a plan, should an agreement be entered into, to formulate a Management Scheme for the Green; it is likely that some areas would be left less regularly cut for conservation purposes and some areas set aside as amenity areas for residents to enjoy or hold village events. It is also proposed that there should be a Conservation Group to give advice on conservation management.

The Parish Council is fully aware that taking on the management of the Green will involve a cost to the Parish through the Parish Precept which forms part of your annual Council Tax; it is in the process of establishing what that cost might be and what grants might be available to defray the cost to the residents of the village.

The Parish Council would be very happy to see as many residents as possible come to the meeting to listen to and give their views. A poll will be taken at the meeting to establish whether or not the residents of the village are supportive of the course of action proposed. This is too important an issue to the whole village for the Parish Council to act without the residents backing.
